THE BACKGROUND

Mankar College, established in 1987, celebrated its Silver Jubilee in the year 2012. Side by side serving the under-privileged students for more than thirty years, the college has been able to uphold the rich tradition of education rooted in the locality. The modern system of education began here when Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar established a normal school in the mid-19th century. In keeping with this tradition the College has established itself as a seat of learning disseminating the fruits of knowledge to a large underdeveloped rural area on the border of and including the more backward *jungle-mahal*.

The initiative for establishing a college was undertaken by the local people in the late 1960s to gain an access in the world of higher education. After years of struggle the College ultimately saw the light of the day on 26th September 1987 in a five acre plot of land donated by Smt. Renubala Devi, a resident of Mankar. The campus expanded when additional land was received as donation from Sri Bireswar Banerjee and his brothers. A large number of people of this locality and surroundings have extended their help for the growth of the college. Of late Smt. Kanaklata Banerjee and her nephew Sri Soumitra Mukherjee have donated 75 decimal of land including a house to the College. The land has been used to construct a UGC funded girls' hostel with an accommodation for 33 boarders.

In 1987 teaching -learning began with six Arts subjects, sixty-three students and six teachers in a thatched roofed mud-walled hut. Three decades later, the College today proudly offers all three streams – Arts, Commerce and Science with Honours in fourteen subjects. Almost one thousand students take admission in First Year Arts alone. Huge buildings have been constructed and is also being constructed in a spacious green campus. The infrastructure has been strengthened by the presence of capacious classrooms, well-equipped laboratories and a well-stocked library. ICT is used in an extensive manner.

The appearance of the college has undergone radical changes, but the performance of the students in the University Examinations has remained exemplary right from the beginning. The success rate over the years has remained uniformly outstanding. By virtue of its students, non-teaching members of the staff and the teachers, Mankar College is recognized as one of the premier institutions affiliated to the University of Burdwan. The ambiance here is calm and quiet, traditional yet modern, disciplined and accommodative -- ideal for the pursuit of knowledge.

This college is famous for its discipline, result, green campus ,sports, student centric learning, peace in the campus and is permanently **affiliated to The University of Burdwan**.

In 2009 National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC) after a visit to assess the college accredited us in grade 'B' with a CGPA of **2.21** on 4(four) point scale. Following the second cycle of assessment in 2016 Mankar College has been awarded the grade 'B+' with a CGPA of **2.58**. Appreciating the performance of the College, the Govt. of India has chosen this college through RUSA (Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan) as one of the 750 selected colleges in the country to receive assistance for infrastructure development. In the third cycle of assessment in 2023 Mankar College has been awarded the grade 'B+' with a CGPA of **2.69**.

LOCATION OF THE COLLEGE

Mankar is well connected by both railways and roadways. Mankar railway station is on Bardhaman-Asansol section of Eastern Railway. Mankar is two kilometers from G T Road. The college is on the Bhatkunda highway, two kilometers from Mankar Railway Station and about a kilometer from the Mankar Bus Stop. It takes less than twenty minutes to reach the college from the railway station on foot. The buses plying to and from Bhedia stop almost at the college gate itself. E-rickshaws and traditional rickshaws are also available in plenty.

ADMISSION IN UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAMMES (2025-26)
4-YEAR B.A./B.Sc./B.Com HONOURS COURSE
or
3 YEAR B.A./B.Sc./ B.Com DEGREE COURSE

The admission process begins immediately after the publication of the results of the Higher Secondary Examinations conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education. From this year the College will admit students for the Bachelor Degree courses in eight semesters and it has introduced Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme (CCFUP) as per NEP, 2020. In keeping with the decision of the Govt. of West Bengal and The University of Burdwan the admission process is conducted online and with complete transparency. Students are admitted on the basis of merit lists generated out of applications received from registered applicants.

Key Points:

1. Admission in the 1st semester of 4 year/3-year undergraduate (UG) Hons./Degree programmes (under CCFUP as per NEP 2020) for the academic session 2025-26 will be online through Centralized Admission Portal (wbcap) strictly on the basis of merit, that is, performance at 10+2/Equivalent level public examination(s) as determined by The University of Burdwan and Higher Education Department, Govt. of West Bengal.
2. Candidates who have passed 10+2/Equivalent level examination from any recognized Council/Board/University (vide list of recognized Board/Council/University) in the year 2022/2023/2024/2025 can apply for admission in UG SEMESTER 1.
3. A student has to register himself or herself to apply for admission. **There is no registration fee.** A registered student seeking admission can apply for 8 subjects in both 3 years and 4 years programme through a single application.
4. One Applicant can apply in 8 subjects through one application including 3 years Degree Programme and 4 Years Honours Programme.
5. Reservation rules are as per G.O. and extant rules of Govt. of W.B.
6. Merit lists for the **all courses** are prepared on the basis of grade point (GP) which is calculated as: **GP = Aggregate of Best four in HS or equivalent examination + marks obtained in HS in the subject in which admission is sought.**
7. An applicant should regularly visit our college website for latest information regarding admission. Our websites: <https://mankarcollege.ac.in/>
8. There are two types course 3 Years Degree Programme and 4 years Honours Programme from this year according to NEP 2020 and as directed by the University of Burdwan. For both the programmes the students have to opt one subject as major course.
9. After the choice of subjects is made, payment for final admission should be done after selecting combination.

10. After successful payment of admission fee a student should save the document and take a print of her/his “**Provisional Admission Receipt**”, containing student details, subject details and fees details with candidate’s signature and photo. **This is important** since the verification will be made on the basis of this document. Students will have to submit this receipt during verification process.
11. While transferring from one subject to another if the required fee is same in both cases, the students will pay only Rs. 20/- as **course transfer fees**. In addition to Rs. 20/- as course transfer fees, a student seeking transfer will have to pay the necessary additional amount for 2nd time of admission in the new subject if the new admission fee is greater than the already paid fee. Refund will be available, if admission fee for 2nd time is less than the already paid fee. “Refund Challan (transfer)” will be generated by the system for students seeking refund of adjusted fees. However, they will have to pay the mandatory course transfer fee of Rs. 20/- which will be deducted from the refund amount.
12. **Cancellation of admission** will be permitted online, but must be cancelled online before the publication of the last merit list of eligible applicants. In that case total refund will be made. It should be noted that the cancellation will be made by sending OTP to the registered mobile number of the candidate. “Refund Challan(Cancellation)” will be generated by the system for students seeking refund after cancelling their admission. After cancelling the admission a student has to produce this challan to the college physically(no online refund) to claim the refund amount after publication of such notice in our website.
- Note: Prayer for refund of submitted fees on cancellation of admission will be entertained till before the expiry of last date admission in respective cycle of admission.**
13. After submission of admission fees, candidates will have to appear for verification on the scheduled date notified by the college in the college website. Students must visit the College Website regularly for getting necessary information regarding admission. During verification process, candidates will have to produce **the original**. For a reserved category seat, a candidate must have her/his own caste certificate/PH certificate. In the absence of original caste certificate/PH certificate, admission will be cancelled.

Any discrepancy in the documents will cause the candidature being summarily cancelled.

14. During **verification** a student will have to produce the **original copy and self attested photocopies** of the following documents:

- a. Admission Receipt
- b. Money Receipt
- c. Admit Card and Marksheet of 10th Standard (Madhyamik) Examination
- d. Mark Sheet of 12th standard (HS) Examination
- e. AADHAR and ABC ID if available
- f. Caste or PH Certificate or EWS Certificate (if applicable)
- g. Registration Certificate (if applicable)
- h. Migration Certificate (if applicable)

15. Admission of a student can be cancelled for three reasons:

- If a student seeks admission for a reserved seat but does not have original caste certificate.
- If a student enters incorrect marks during form fill up and GP is calculated according to this incorrect entry--her/his admission will be cancelled.
- If after paying admission fees a student does not come to college for classes for one month from the commencement of classes her/his admission will be cancelled.

COURSES OFFERED

As per the norms of **Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme (CCFUP)** the three year degree course is divided into six semesters(three years). An Honours student will study two extra semesters and their course will be of four years duration.

Guideline of Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programme (CCFUP) as per NEP, 2020

Undergraduate Degree Programmes will be of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications such as:

- a UG Certificate after completing 1 year (2 Semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study,
- a UG Diploma after 2 years (4 Semesters) of study,
- a Bachelor's Degree after a 3-year (6 Semesters) programme of study,
- a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) after a 4-year (8 Semesters) programme of study. If the students complete a rigorous research project/ dissertation in their major area(s) of study in the 4th year of a bachelor's degree then (Honours with Research).
- A semester comprises **90 working days** and an academic year is divided into two semesters.
- A summer term is for **eight weeks during summer vacation**. Internship/ apprenticeship/ work-based vocational education and training can be carried out during the summer term, especially by students who wish to exit after two semesters or four semesters of study. Regular courses may also be offered during the summer on a fast-track mode to enable students to do additional courses or complete backlogs in coursework. The HEIs can decide on the courses to be offered in the summer term depending on the availability of faculty and the number of students.
- Honours students not undertaking research will do 3 courses for 12 credits in lieu of a research project / Dissertation.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) 08 credits :

Skills Enhancement Courses (SEC):

These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills etc., to enhance the employability of students. The institution may design courses as per the students' needs and available institutional resources.

Common Value Added (CVA)

Common to All UG Students (6-8 credits)

- Understanding India
- Environmental Science / Education
- Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports and fitness

Summer Internship /Apprenticeship (2 - 4 credits): Community engagement and service, Field-based learning/Minor Project.

All students will also undergo internships / Apprenticeships in a firm, industry, or organization or Training in labs with faculty and researchers in their own or other HEIs/research institutions during the summer term.

Students will be provided with opportunities for internships with local industry, business organizations, health and allied areas, local governments (such as panchayats, municipalities), Parliament or elected representatives, media organizations, artists, crafts persons, and a wide variety of organizations so that students may actively engage with the practical side of their learning and, as a by-product, further improve their employability. Students who wish to exit after the first two semesters will undergo a 4-credit work based learning/internship during the summer term in order to get a UG Certificate.

Community engagement and service: The curricular component of 'community engagement and service' seeks to expose students to the socio-economic issues in society so that the theoretical learning can be supplemented by actual life experiences to generate solutions to real-life problems. This can be part of summer term activity or part of a major or minor course depending upon the major discipline

Field-based learning/minor project: The field-based learning/minor project will attempt to provide opportunities for students to understand the different socioeconomic contexts. It will aim at giving students exposure to development-related issues in rural and urban settings. It will provide opportunities for students to observe situations in rural and urban contexts, and to observe and study actual field situations regarding issues related to socio-economic development. Students will be given opportunities to gain a first-hand understanding of the policies, regulations, organizational structures, processes, and programmes that guide the development process. They would have the opportunity to gain an understanding of the complex socio-economic problems in the community, and innovative practices required to generate solutions to the identified problems. This may be a summer term project or part of a major or minor course depending on the subject of study.

Research Project / Dissertation

Students choosing a 4-Year Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) are required to take up research projects under the guidance of a faculty member. The students are expected to complete the Research Project in the eighth semester. The research outcomes of their project work may be published in peer-reviewed journals or may be presented in conferences /seminars or may be patented.

Other Activities:

This component will include participation in activities related to National Service Scheme (NSS), National Cadet Corps (NCC), Adult Education/Literacy Initiatives, Mentoring School Students, and Other similar activities.

The undergraduate programme seeks to equip students with the capacities in fields across arts, humanities, languages, natural sciences, and social sciences; an ethic of social engagement; soft skills such as complex problem solving, critical thinking, creative thinking, and communication skills, along with rigorous specialization in a chosen disciplinary or interdisciplinary major and minor(s).

Semesters 1 & 2: The students will undergo courses in **4 broad disciplines** [Major stream, Minor stream, 2 broad disciplines (multidisciplinary category)] to have basic knowledge not only in major areas but also in two other disciplines broadly grouped under Natural and Physical Sciences, Mathematics, Statistics and Computer Applications, Library, Information and Media Sciences, Commerce and Management, and Social Sciences. With exposure to basic courses in four disciplines, a student can decide to continue the chosen major or change the major and minor areas of interest at the end of the second semester. Additionally, these students will also take up courses of their interest from Ability Enhancement (language), Skill Enhancement, and Value-Added categories.

Semesters 3 & 4: Students will choose courses of their interest in major and minor to build a career of their interest. They also pursue courses to strengthen their language skills and other skill-augmenting courses and vocational training.

Semesters 5 & 6: Students will undergo higher level courses and related courses during the 5th and 6th semesters in order to gain in-depth knowledge in the major and also in the related disciplines through the minor stream. Students will also gain work-related skills through courses in vocational education. The programme structure will enable the students to gain sufficient knowledge and skills to meet the industry/society requirements.

Semesters 7 & 8: During the 4th and final year, students will undertake advanced level courses in both major and minor streams to get a UG Degree (Honours). Students choose a research component with courses relating to research methodology, advanced courses in theory and applied areas, and seminar presentations. Students may be permitted to carry out a research project or dissertation in another department of the same institution or another institution provided the required facilities are available.

OTHER FACILITIES AVAILABLE

GIRLS' HOSTEL:: Mankar College has a fully furnished hostel for the girl students constructed with financial help from the UGC, the hostel has a capacity to accommodate 33 students.

FREE STUDENTSHIP:: The College awarded free studentship and half-free studentship to deserving students for many years. But, as from 2012-13 the College has to submit to the State Government 50% of the tuition fee received, the scope for awarding these has been greatly reduced. However, the College has appealed to the UGC for grants to offer stipends to deserving SC/ST/OBC A&B (non-creamy layer)/minority students.

STUDENTS' WELFARE FUND:: A few financially insolvent students, who are unable to pay the tuition fees and other dues, are helped from this fund. Income certificate of the guardian has to be submitted while applying for the aid. Sincerity and regularity of the student concerned are taken into account for deciding the beneficiaries.

ACADEMIC DIARY:: The academic diary informs the student about the academic activities of the college throughout the year.

RAILWAY CONCESSION:: The regular students of the college are issued Railway Concession for travelling from the residence to the college and back.

CYCLE STAND:: The college has stands for the bi-cycles and motor-bikes of the students. The students do not have to pay any fee to use the stands.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE:: The students of different departments bring out Wall Magazines which are periodically re-furnished. The college also publishes an Annual Magazine, guided by the teachers, enriched with the creative efforts of the students.

STUDENTS' COUNCIL :: As per the statute of the Burdwan University, the Students' Union is formed every year by the elected representatives of all the different classes. The Students' Union has traditionally played a very constructive role and looked after the welfare of the students. It safeguards the interest of both the students and the institution. **But as per the instruction of the West Bengal State Govt. there is no Students' Council at present.**

LIBRARY:: The spacious and fully computerized College Library has more than 16,000 books. Every student is encouraged to use the library for both text and reference books. The reading room widens the scope of the students for utilizing the library in a more profitable way. Every student must take good care of the books in the interest of all other students. Adequate compensation has to be made for spoiling or mutilating the library books.

INFLIBNET:: The college is registered under the N-LIST Programme and has access to more than 2100 e-journals (including current issues with 5-10 years back files) and more than 55,100 e-books. The resources are accessible from <http://nlist.inflibnet.ac.in> as soon as a user from the college logs in.

NCC:: The College has a very active unit of 10th Bn. Bengal NCC with individual boys' and girls' wings. Any student having a sound health and the spirit to serve the nation may join the NCC and gain valuable training. A graduate NCC cadet has great job opportunities.

NSS :: The College has two units of NSS. Its motto ‘not me but you’ teaches a student to be a broad-minded and responsible member of the society. The NSS carries out different programmes of social significance all through the year.

All students of general courses are expected to join either NCC or NSS.

PHOTO-COPYING FACILITY :: The college has its own photocopying facility. The students can make photocopies of their documents in the college itself at a minimum cost.

POWER BACK-UP:: The college has one 40 KV and one 5 KV Diesel Generator Sets (silent mode) installed to provide 24 hours uninterrupted power supply.

INTERNET FACILITIES::The UGC Network Resource Centre of the college offers Broadband internet facilities to the students and the teachers. Broadband connections are also available to different departments, staffroom and library. Wi-Fi facility is also available.

OFFICE: The college office is computerized. The staff is cooperative and is capable of discharging huge workload efficiently and quickly.

SPORTS AND GAMES:: There are adequate facilities for out-door and in-door games. Students from the College have regularly participated in a variety of sports and games competitions at the University and District level and have won many prizes.

PRIZE FOR MERITORIOUS STUDENTS :: Kamala Kanta – Manorama Prizes (funded by a lover of education) are given away every year to the best performers in the 3 Year Degree Final Honours and General Examinations of each of Arts, Commerce and Science streams on the day of the Annual Cultural Function.

RURAL MUSEUM : The college has a rural museum that exhibits the best of the essence of Bengal’s social and cultural life . This museum holds a lot of importance in the present time due to rapid desertion of the rural Bengal. The old customs and traditions, which were widespread till the last few years, are now taking a backseat with the involvement of technological advancement . Hence It is one of the must visit places for any UG student of Bengal. This museum certainly exhibits the best of the essence of Bengali culture. If truth be told, Mankar College is the only college in the state to have such a museum.

SEMINARS:: National, international and students seminars are arranged regularly to help the students become conscious of the cultural, social, medical, career related and other issues to make them grow into good members of the society. National and International Webinars are organized regularly during the lockdown period.

ANTI RAGGING COMMITTEE:: This committee prohibits any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act or indulging in rowdy or in disciplined activities which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, or students. Strict disciplinary, and if needed, penal actions are taken in such cases.

COMMITTEE FOR THE PREVENTION OF SEXUAL HARASSMENTS::As per the directives of the Supreme Court of India, this committee deals with any act of sexual harassments very strictly to maintain a healthy academic atmosphere.
